

Summary of Credentials of Energy Forum Panelists

Keynote Speaker: Dr. Dan M. Ervin

The Wilson H. Elkins distinguished professor and an associate professor of finance at Salisbury University, Franklin P. Perdue School of Business. He is also director of ShoreENERGY – a university based program that encourages prudent and innovative use of state-of-the-art energy technologies. Professor Ervin has extensive experience in electric utility employment. His current research addresses management decisions and how these decisions affect the value of corporations.

George Hamilton:

Spent 30 years in the nuclear power industry in engineering and management positions from nuclear fuel design and plant construction to decommissioning and waste disposal. He was also an executive in the river terminal business and is a consultant with clients in the U.S. and Venezuela.
